

Each authorized employee shall receive adequate training. The training should address that all affected employees are instructed in the purpose & use of the energy control procedure. There should be training provisions included for any other employee whose work operations are or may be in an area where energy control procedures may be utilized. The employee training should also address when tagout systems are used, including the limitations of a tag (tags are warning devices & do not provide physical restraint). The training should also include that a tag is not to be removed without authorization. The tag is never to be ignored or defaced in any way. Retraining is required when there is a change in job assignments, in machines, a change in the energy control procedures, or a new hazard is introduced. All training and/or retraining must be documented, signed & certified.
